

For November, we will have a series of activities that relate to the eleventh month of the year such as, The Day of the Dead and Thanksgiving.

Halloween: October 30 -November 10

On Halloween, the children should wear their costumes and will have the traditional visit to the Milwaukee Catholic Home next door, to collect candy and later during the day a party will take place to continue the celebration. During the party, the children will be introduced to the Mexican culture; they will listen to music and will color images that relate to the movie Coco; also, during these days, and since the children are sensitive to meals and sleeping times, we will make accommodations and prepare the children for daylight savings.

News from The Jungle Room



Last month we had a wonderful month celebrating Halloween by going trick or treating at the hospital and Milwaukee Catholic home. We also had fun experiences with pumpkins by scooping out the insides and playing counting games with the pumpkin seeds. We did lots

of creative arts with paint, and we displayed our works of art around our classroom. We did pretend play with our dolls and practiced taking turns with our classroom toys, we talked about our emotions and did lots of large motor activities. The kids enjoyed Fire safety week! We pretended putting out a fire from the play house the kids were wearing their firefighting gear and we also used a water hose. Look out for picture displays in the hallway. Thank you for bringing in the pumpkins to decorate.

This month we will be working on recognizing our body parts, and we will also be working on a letter each day A, E, I, O, U. We will have a Thanksgiving theme as we get closer to Thanksgiving and a unit on transportation.

A E I O U Nov 6th thru Nov 10th

This week we will learn a new letter each day. On Monday we will work on recognizing the letter A. We will talk about what feelings start will the letter A and for a craft activity we will decorate the letter A with different materials. We will practice saying our letters in Spanish,

sing the ABC song and counting cheerios as we glue cheerios onto the letter O, we will play toss the bean bag on the letter O. For the letter E we will listen to the Elmo song with our listening ears and do an Elmo craft. For the letter I we will glue different materials onto an ice cream template. For the letter U we will sing a song called I LOVE YOU and practice showing and understanding our feelings, for craft activities we will do some water color painting. The kids will enjoy marching around the room to the sona, The ants go marching.

BODY PARTS Nov 13th thru Nov 17th

During this week we will be singing songs where there is lots of movement that includes stomping our feet, clapping our hands, shaking our hips, and just enjoying learning all about the amazing things our bodies can do. We will practice using some sign language words like: eat, more, please, thank you, mom, and dad. We will have some Puppet play this week and do some alphabet puddle jumping activities. For group activities we will do some finger painting on white paper, use

playdough to make people.

We will practice using our hands for gentle touches, and remember our feet are for walking and kicking balls.

We will be practicing putting on our coats, mittens, shoes, and hats. We would appreciate if the parents would practice this with their kids at home.

THANKGIVING WEEK Nov 20th thru Nov 24th

This week we will be talking about gratitude and giving thanks to family and friends. For Family partnership, I will be sending home a cut out turkey pattern and have the parents glue feathers and write what the family is thankful for. For group time we will read the books: Run turkey run, 10 fat turkeys. For craft activities we will be gluing different fruits and vegetable to glue on a Cornucopia, and pumpkin pie slice craft. This week is all about transportation and talking about places you could go using different forms of transportation, we will read some transportation books, and make sounds of the different kinds of transportation we may see. All About Me Week November 13-17


